

Primary Physical Education and Sport Premium 2021-22

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum until 2022 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head Teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. All schools will receive £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil per academic year.

Schools are free to spend the School Sports Funding as they see fit. However they will be accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupil progress in PE and Games and pupil accessibility to high quality provision and opportunity within and beyond the school day.
